

Designate a Safe Room in Your Home

There are several possible locations in a house for a shelter. Perhaps the most convenient and safest is below ground level, in a <u>basement</u>.

Another alternative shelter location is an <u>interior room</u> on the first floor of a house. Closets, bathrooms, and small storage rooms offer the advantage of having a function other than providing occasional storm protection. Typically, these rooms have only one door and no windows, which make them well-suited for conversion to a shelter.

<u>Bathrooms</u> have the added advantage of a water supply and toilet. Regardless of where in a house a shelter is built, the walls and ceiling of the shelter must be built so that they will protect the occupants from falling debris, and so that they will remain standing if the house is severely damaged by extreme winds.
